

FUNKY OWLS



Dead Easy Technique, using standard Bisque shapes!

We've used Bisque mug **HBT2658**, and Bowls **HBT454** + **HBT453**

The Colours You'll need are:

SC86 - to basecoat the inside of the bowls, and outside of the mug

FN8 - For the dark brown outside the bowls, inside the mug

SC11 - **SC14** - **SC17** - **SC18** - **SC24** - **SC70** - **SC76** for the designs

We used a **stamp** for the writing, you don't have to, why not freestyle your own message!

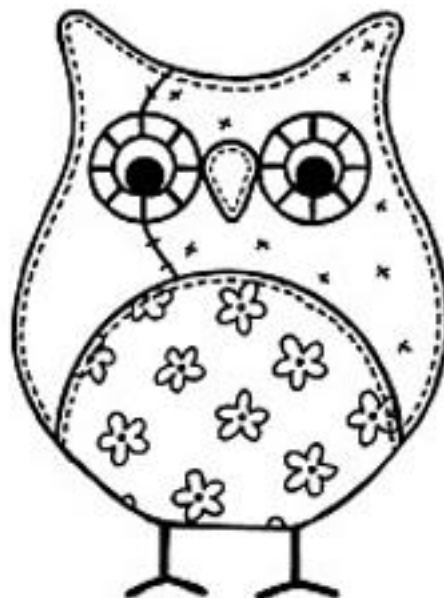
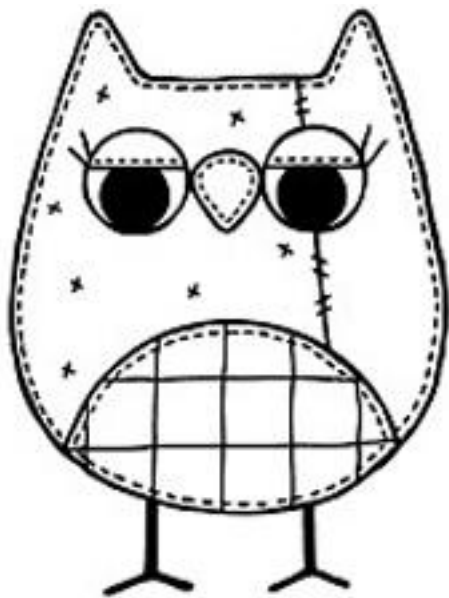
The **pattern** you'll need, is on the back of this sheet. . . . go on, take a look!

Also, a **Banding Wheel** will be super-helpful, to really nail those crisp bands on the edges!

...you ready!? Flip the sheet and follow the simple step by step instructions.



Here are the patterns for you... Trace them, copy them... make paper aeroplanes out of them if you like!



Here's how to do it...

1. With a damp sponge, wipe piece to remove any dust and check piece is good.
2. Dilute Foundation Brown, (3 parts glaze to 1 part water) pour this glaze into the mug and roll around, right up to the lip. Allow to drain, remove drips with damp sponge.
3. Apply 3 coats of Old Lace to outside of mug and inside of bowl. Apply 3 coats of Brown Foundation to the outside of the bowl.
4. Trace the owl patterns onto your piece. Careful not to press too hard so you indent the glaze.

The Bowls we used fit together perfectly as a set.

5. Using Stroke + Coat colours apply 1 or 2 coats to each area, lighter colours first. Add patterns with darker colours.
6. Use liner brush and Java Bean to outline and add small stitch detail. Add wording with Java Bean. If using a stamp use neat colour and a sponge on a stick, test on paper first.
7. Place piece in centre of banding wheel and using a large soft brush apply 2 coats of diluted Rosey Posey to edge.
8. Fire to cone 06 (1000C). (no need to glaze)
