Technique Sheet: Flowery Finger Mug

This technique shows you how to use new Foundations colours to create a beautiful spring-like mug to freshen up your morning tea!



Shape: **Mayco Bisque**
MB1083 Finger Mug

Colour: **Mayco Foundations Colours:**
FN-014 Foundations White
FN-012 Foundations Lavender

Mayco Stroke & Coat Colours:

SC-15 Tuxedo
SC-26 Green Thumb
SC-6 Sunkissed
SC-70 Pink-A-Dot

Moulding mat:

MAT366 Fruit Blossoms
(or for a more abstract look, try MAT352 Jumbo Swirl Blocks)

- Begin with properly fired shelf cone 04 Bisque. Moisten a clean Sponge and wipe Bisque to remove any dust.
- Using a soft fan brush, apply 3 coats of FN-012 Lavender to the inside of the mug.
- Once dry, apply 3 coats of FN-014 Antique White to the outside of the mug. Allow to dry.
- When dry, stamp with the Fruit Blossoms Stamp. To stamp, use a sponge with SC-15 Tuxedo to apply the colour to the stamp. Press stamp to the mug.
- Use sections of the stamp to fill in to create an all-over design.
- Thin SC-26 Green Thumb and SC-70 Pink-A-Dot slightly.
- Using a Liner Brush, apply 1 coat of SC-26 Green Thumb to the leaves. Apply 1 coat of SC-70 Pink-A-Dot to the petals. Apply 1 coat of thinned SC-6 Sunkissed to the centres of the flowers.
- Using a Liner Brush, apply 2 coats of SC-15 Tuxedo to the handle. Allow to dry.
- Dry-foot the mug by wiping all glaze from the bottom surface that will touch the kiln shelf, using a damp sponge.
- Fire to shelf cone 06.
